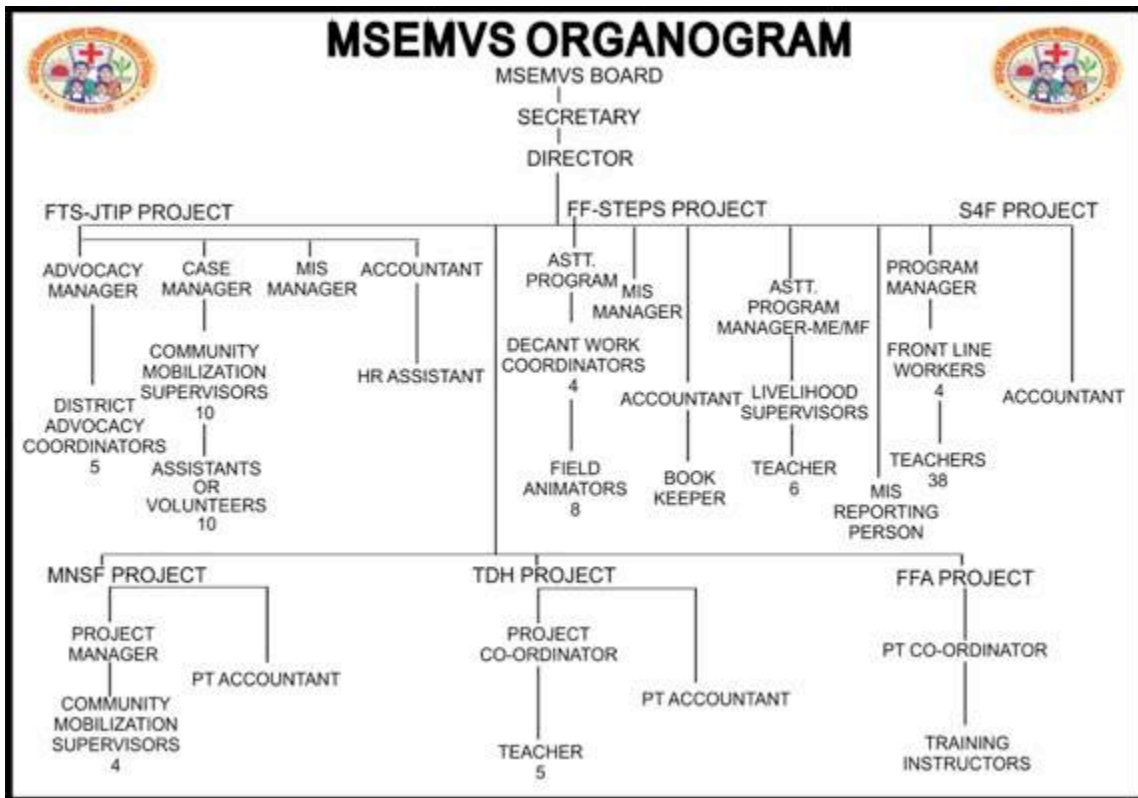


MSEMVS is a state level non government organization (NGO). It was established in 1990 under guidance of veteran social scientist and contemporary Vice Chancellor of the University & M.P (Member of Parliament), Prof. Raja Ram Shastri.

It is a secular and non-political Institution, which intended working for the last person in the society with the philosophy of Mahatma Gandhi.

**MSEMVS** has been working on the issues of children and women focusing bonded labour, debt bondage, child labour and human trafficking through protection and prevention since 1996. **Bonded Labour, Debt Bondage, Human Trafficking for forced labour and Child Protection** are the key themes of the work.

Around 1996, MSEMVS began to work directly on issues of trafficking, child labour, and bonded labour. On 16th December 1996, Supreme Court of India given a historical Judgment on child labour, the enforcement agencies speeded up their efforts to get the children out from hazardous work. A number of child labour rescued from carpet also without any effective mechanism of their rehabilitation. MSEMVS realized that in absence of proper rehabilitation the children would again be moved to work. MSEMVS started 1<sup>st</sup> ever its Transitional School in one village and Anti Slavery work started from one village and reached out more than 480 villages.



## Combating Trafficking and Bonded Labour:

MSEMVS facilitates the bonded labour **survivors taking lead on the issues** & Ensures sustainable freedom through Community Vigilance Committees (**CVC**) and **Micro-Finance and Micro-Enterprises**.

MSEMVS worked for Eradicating trafficking, child labour, bonded labour in 8 districts in UP, 1 district in Jharkhand and 2 districts in Chhattisgarh.

In above districts MSEMVS served to more than 8000 individuals in 250 Villages

For Providing Service to the Community members MSEMVS had adopted and integrated approach consist with linking the people with Government Entitlements, providing non formal education, providing Vocational Skill, Formation of SHG and support Microenterprise program and rescue the Victims with the help of Administration and proper Rehabilitation of the survivors.

During 2017-18 some of the Key activities and Achievements are as follows:

A part of above MSEMVS Organized training for Police official, Labour Depart Official, ICPS official, DBLVC and village level Frontline Service Providers. More than 435 Government Officer are participated such training Program.

MSEMVS Supported to the Rescued Survivor for ensuring the justice in their legal cases. 232 Individuals Supported Accessing Legal rights and Pursue the Cases in the courts.

With above all MSEMVS also worked for Strengthening Mechanisms for Protecting Children women and adults from trafficking, child labour, and bonded labour. MSEMVS has Supported Village child Protection Committees, district bonded labour Vigilance Committees and Scholl Management Committees.

This intervention was supported by different donors mainly Free the Slaves, Geneva Global –Freedom Fund and MNS foundation.







## **Sensitization and empowerment of community for eradication of child labour and prevention of child trafficking:**

MSEMVS has targeted to empower the communities for preventing children from trafficking and strengthening child protection mechanism in Jamalpur Block of Mirzapur.

### **Major Achievements:**

MSEMVS filed team-collected data from <b>18 villages (revenue)</b> and village profiles updated in order to planning for village level intervention.
18 community groups formed during previous reporting period made strengthened in order to ensuring community participation towards vigilance on the child labour and child trafficking including distressed migration.
Altogether <b>2191</b> (estimated) individuals supported for different Govt. services.
Community help desk were conducted with the help of PRI, civil society and Govt. frontline workers. I 18 villages the community help desk helped community people to get the information and access govt schemes.
Health camps organized in the middle of the cluster and it covered 3-4 villages in the cluster. The Govt. health service providers provided counseling, free health check-up, Referrals and free medicines to the community members in the villages.
18 existing SHGs with 193 women membership capacitated trough regular monthly meetings, quarterly trainings and time-to-time supportive supervisions.
107 women members from 10 SHG's joined various skill trainings and completed their trainings in detergent powder making, tailoring and incense sticks. Marketing skills of agro based productions.

3 Remedial centers continued and 104 students attended the classes in MSEMVS project area.
18 Groups/clubs of the youth/young adults formed in 18 villages with the membership of 146 youth/young adults. During 2017 altogether 49 youth club meetings conducted and more than 140 members informed about child rights/trafficking/risky migration.
99 youths /adolescent enrolled in vocational skill training and completed their vocational trainings in tailoring and screen-printing.
In all 18 working villages MSEMVS worked for restructuring and activating the village level Child Protection Committees. In 12 villages 12 VCPC (village level Child Protection Committees) activated and quarterly meetings were facilitated. Altogether 87 members actively participated in VCPC meeting.

This intervention was supported by TDH (G) IP.



## **Strengthening community to resist child labour and bonded labour through education and livelihood.**

MSEMVS provided the Non Formal Education to the children came out from child labour. 56 children enrolled in MSEMVS run Non Formal Education centers and provided accelerated education including human rights education. One Non Formal Education center operated in the community and one was at the Brick Kiln.



In order to making community aware about debt bondage and human trafficking MSEMVS formed the Community Freedom Groups and human rights education, Risk and Rights Education provided through small group meetings, training and exposures to other empowered groups of survivors. With FFA support MSEMVS has done this work in 12 communities in Varanasi. More than 300 individuals including debt bondage and human trafficking victims, survivors and at risk people participated in the awareness generation activities and learned about risk and rights related to debt bondage and human trafficking.





During 2017-18 altogether 151 women and youth received training in following trades and started their micro-enterprises and got employment:

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### **Ensuring Rights to Education:**

MSEMVS team implemented transitional school and Remedial coaching project for the children come out from child labour and debt bondage slavery. We are providing non – formal education to children. There are 19 Non – formal schools in this project in different areas.

MSEMVS Educational program consisted:

- Each MSEMVS School enrolls averaging 45-55 children, usually 6 – 14 years.
- In every transitional school there are 2 teachers appointed for the children. For the improvement of the quality of education the children are divided in 2 groups (according to their Age and Minimum learning level of the children) and teachers are responsible for their groups.
- We teach them through conducting activities and actions, which continue their interest in learning. The teachers ensure all the things.
- In every Non – formal School MSEMVS provided educational materials, hot cooked food (Mid – Day - Meal) every day for the children.
- We prepared every children progress report card and we evaluate the children in every quarter and after the evolution we maintain the children progress in progress report card.
- For the leadership building of the children we forms children forum, its gives a good platform to the children. In every children forum meeting MSEMVS team do capacity building of the children.
- In every Saturday we organize a special class for the children. On this day the teachers help children in learning help line numbers, song on bonded labour and Human Rights education.
- In addition, teachers and front line worker emphasize the following areas:
- Awareness generating and advocacy on the local level.

- Community organization and self-help group.
- Legal rights, illegality of bonded labour and child labour in India's law
- Hygiene and cleanness.

Their parents supported accessing their socio – economic rights and entitlements. MSEMVS worked for livelihood reintegration of the community members in Musher hamlet in 19 village 17 Self-help groups' strengthened. Micro finance and Micro Enterprises plan prepared in self – help groups. MSEMVS are providing skill training to SHG women like as – Candle making , Washing powder , Clothes bag , Tufted , Fishery, Goat rearing and cultivation.
